The goals of this implementation were set during pre-implementation meetings in cooperation with the district and focused on building and maintaining an equitable culture and climate of learning for leaders, teachers, and students. Professional learning was then designed to support the successful ongoing implementation of ARC Core <sup>®</sup> to result in improving learning outcomes for all students, removing any systemic barriers.

During this past year of implementation, the district's goal was to strengthen grade-level instruction. Using the ARC Core scope and sequence and the instructional checklists, leadership teams collaborated to model effective instruction and monitor for fidelity. Teacher teams and coaches co-planned and co-taught lessons from ARC Core and used checklists and structured systems of feedback to monitor integrity of the implementation.
Ongoing coaching focused on fostering an engaged culture for readers and writers, providing rigorous, grade-level instruction through the use of high-quality texts, and ensuring differentiated supports to sustain the growth of all students. The ARC and system leadership teams used SchoolPace <sup>®</sup> (ARC's performance management system), state assessment data, and participant surveys to monitor progress toward key metrics, such as levels of engagement, growth rates, proficiency percentages, and conference schedules.
